DAILY DEVOTIONS

DAY 1: THE IMPOSSIBLE

READ - Genesis 17:17; 18:11-12; 21:1-3

Set a timer for 30 seconds, and direct your child to wait quietly until the timer beeps. Boy that felt like forever, didn't it? Waiting can be really hard! In the Bible, God promised a man named Abraham and his wife Sarah a son. They were getting really old! How could they have a baby now? But God is Lord of All! He can do anything, and He did give Abraham and Sarah a baby after all that waiting! God can do the impossible for us too! Let's shout our special words together: **God is Lord of all!**

DAY 2: FAMILY TREE

READ - Genesis 12:2-3

Draw a family tree for your child. Did you know that if we made a family tree for Jesus, He would be in Abraham's family? In Genesis, the first book in the Bible, God promised that He would make Abraham's family into a great nation - His people, the Israelites! Through Abraham's family, God would bless the whole world by sending Jesus, His Son! Abraham didn't know how that would happen, but he trusted and obeyed God. God can do anything! Let's say our special words together in our squeaky voices: **God is Lord of all!**

DAY 3: A TO Z

READ - Revelation 22:13

Show your child an alphabet and point at the letter A. Explain that the letter A represents the beginning; the alphabet starts with A. See if your child can find the end, or the last letter (Z). In Greek, the word alpha means beginning, and the word omega means end. The Bible calls God the alpha and omega, the beginning and the end. God was there before the world was even created! Let's say our special words in our deep voices: **God is Lord of all!**

DAY 4: GOD IS IN CONTROL

READ - Genesis 1:1, Mark 4:37-41, Mark 2:10-12, Mark 16:6

Can you make rain stop and the sun come out? No, of course not! But there is somebody who can - God! God showed us His power by creating the whole world. He showed us His power through His Son, Jesus, who calmed the storm and healed people who were sick. He showed us His power when Jesus died on the cross and then came back to life three days later! God can do anything and everything! Let's whisper our special words together: **God is Lord of all!**

DAY 5: UNSTOPPABLE GOD

READ - 1 Corinthians 8:6, Romans 11:36

This week we learned that God can do anything! He is the one true God who created the whole world! Just as God did what seemed impossible for Abraham and Sarah by giving them a baby, He can do the impossible for us too! Let's praise God for how awesome and powerful He is! Turn on praise music and have a dance party! Remember: **God is Lord of all!**



WHO'S ON THE THRONE

Materials: Chair, Various Decorations, Paper Crown

Choose one chair in your home to be a “throne.” Decorate it with ribbons, streamers, or special fabric. Draw or print out a crown on paper. Cut out the crown and decorate it. Have your family members take turns sitting on the throne and wearing the crown. Pretend that whoever is sitting on the throne is a king or queen. He or she can direct the other family members to jump up and down or sing a funny song. Get creative and have fun dreaming up ideas!

After playing the game talk about the following questions as a family:

- A king or queen sits on a worldly throne. Who sits on the throne of heaven?
- If your heart has a throne what would it look like to let God be the king?



SHINING STARS

Materials: 5 Popsicle Sticks, Glue, Various Art Supplies

Genesis 15:5-6 “He took him outside and said, “Look up at the sky and count the stars—if indeed you can count them.” Then he said to him, “So shall your offspring be.” Abram believed the Lord, and he credited it to him as righteousness.”

You can do the same thing God told Abraham to do. Tonight, go outside and look up at the stars. See how many stars you can count. It does not take long to see that there are just too many to count. God’s promise to Abraham was that his children, and his children’s children, and so on, would be as many as the stars.

Make your own star by gluing five craft sticks together as seen in the picture. Color with markers and decorate with any art supplies you have at home. Write, “God is Lord of All” on your star as a reminder.



CUDDLE CLOSE

Materials: None

Before bed pull your child close beside you and say, “I can count on God because He is Lord of all!” As you tuck them into bed, sing, “My God is Number One” (www.tinyurl.com/myGodis1). Then pray together, pausing after each phrase, to let your child repeat after you:

*Dear God,
Thank you for having a plan for my life.
Help me to learn more about you.
You are Lord of all.
In Jesus’ name, Amen.*
