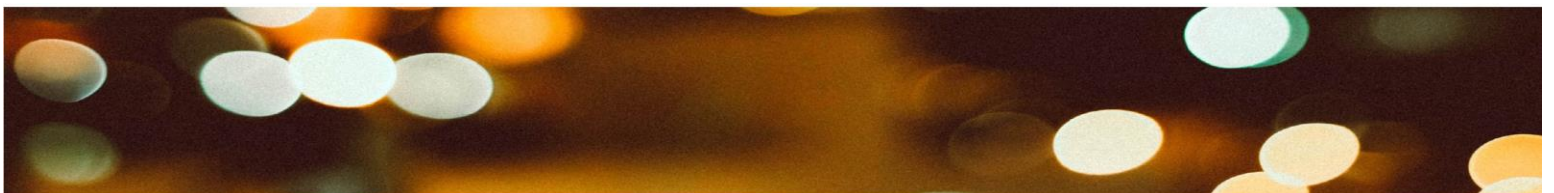
OVERVIEW

Advent can bring warm holiday feelings for a lot of us. We think of family, friends, and maybe even the Advent Christmas calendars that have a little piece of chocolate for each day in December leading up to Christmas. But Advent is so much more. It is the anticipation of the arrival of Jesus. How can this reshape how we view and practice Advent this season?

Scripture: Luke 2:25-38 (NLT)

APPLICATION

- Jeremy mentioned his experience with chocolate. What comes to your mind when you think of Advent?
- We all anticipate things, such as: our children opening presents, the arrival of a grandchild, a semester of college being finished, etc. Share something you are currently looking forward to and anticipating in your life.
- Spiritually speaking, what are you anticipating God doing in and through you during this Christmas season?
- Jeremy challenged us to go on an adventure with God this Christmas by doing three things: 1 - Place ourselves in environments where we anticipate hearing from God. 2 - Allow our anticipation to lead us to a response. 3 - Share what we have heard with others. What is the biggest obstacle that might keep you from doing these things during this Christmas season?
- Obstacles keep us from experiencing God in fresh and new ways. Looking at your answer to the last question, how can you remove that obstacle?

ADVENT | ANTICIPATION

This week we will read Scripture that reveals the great anticipation among the Jews of the Messiah's coming. What did they anticipate? A Messiah that would bring salvation to them. Why was their anticipation so great? Because they knew the best was yet to come.

But Jesus' coming wasn't the first time God's people experienced great anticipation. Throughout Scripture we see a pattern: God makes a promise to His people, God's people wait with anticipation, & God faithfully fulfills His promise.

Day 1 Savior

The Anticipation

God spoke to the Old Testament prophets & promised Israel a Savior, a Ruler, Immanuel (God with us), & described Jesus' birth in detail centuries before it happened.

Isaiah 7:14 NIV

Micah 5:2 NIV

The Fulfillment

God gave the long awaited Messiah, Jesus.

Luke 2:8-12 NLT

Day 2 Messiah

The Anticipation: God told Simeon that he would see the Messiah with his own eyes.

Luke 2:25-27 NLT

The Fulfillment: After waiting, Simeon recognized the baby Jesus as Messiah, & praised God for fulfilling His promises.

Luke 2:28-32 NLT

Day 3 Immanuel

The Anticipation

God would come as a man to dwell with His people.

Isaiah 7:14

The Fulfillment: God sent Jesus to dwell with man and bring salvation so we can forever dwell with God in Heaven.

Matthew 1:22-23

Day 4 Wonderful Counselor

The Anticipation: God promised to send a Counselor who would reign over man forever.

Isaiah 9:6-7

The Fulfillment: When Jesus returned to Heaven, He left the Holy Spirit to counsel us and show us the Father.

John 14: 25-26

Day 5 Peace

The Anticipation: God promised to rule over and provide eternal peace to His people.

Isaiah 9:7

The Fulfillment: Jesus said we would have trials and sorrows, but through the Holy Spirit, He gives His people His peace.

John 16:33

John 14: 27

Day 6 Christ's Second Coming

The Anticipation: Scripture tells us that Christ will return again to gather His people who are eagerly awaiting Him.

Hebrews 9:27-28

Matthew 24:44

This Fulfillment is yet to come...

Revelation 1:7-8

Day 7 Eternity

The Anticipation: There will be a day when those who are in Christ Jesus will live with Him forever in Heaven for all eternity. This Fulfillment is yet to come...

Revelation 21: 1-5a

ADVENT | PREPARATION

This week's verses show us how John the Baptist, "prepared the way of the Messiah." John's preparation of the Christ had everything to do with his heart. As you read, consider how God wants to change your heart.

Day 1 The Prophecy

Old Testament prophets described the messenger (John the Baptist) who would come before Christ.

Malachi 3:1
Isaiah 40:3-5

Day 2 Thanksgiving

The father of John the Baptist prepares for Christ by singing a song of thanksgiving.

Luke 1:76-80

Day 3 Identity

John the Baptist knew His identity: one who prepared the way for the Messiah.

John 1:19-26
Matthew 3:11-17

Day 4 Humility

John the Baptist had many followers, yet he maintained a posture of humility and servanthood.

John 1:24-27
John 3:27-31

Day 5 Repentance

John the Baptist's message of preparation was simple: Repentance - turn your heart back to God.

Matthew 3:1-2

Day 6 Recognition

John the Baptist recognized Jesus for who He was - the Savior who would take away the sin of the world.

John 1:29-34

Day 7 Baptism

John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord by baptizing Jesus.

Matthew 3:13-17

ADVENT | INCARNATION: GOD WITH US

Jesus was sent by God to earth in the form of a man; this is the Incarnation. Why was Jesus sent? To fulfill the covenant God made with man: to make a way of salvation so that God could dwell with man.

Day 1 Covenant

God made an agreement with man that He would make a way to be with them in close relationship, forever.

Ezekiel 37: 26-28

Day 2 Conception

God did the impossible; Mary conceived a child when she was still a virgin.

Luke 1:30-37

Day 3 Dwelt

Jesus created all things before the beginning of time. He allowed himself to become part of the creation to dwell with us.

John 1:1-5, 14

Day 4 Servant

Jesus, being God, humbled Himself for us. He served us while He lived on earth, and continues to serve us through the Holy Spirit today.

Philippians 2:5-8

Day 5 The Cross

Jesus took on the sins of the world so that we could have peace with God.

1 Peter 2: 22-25

Day 6 High Priest

Jesus is our great high priest, the one who stands before God on our behalf.

Hebrews 10:11-18

Day 7 Fulfilled in Heaven

In Heaven, we will fully know Jesus and spend all eternity with Him.
